

A Busy Christmas Season

Parade day, December 6, seems so long ago now, but the memories shine bright as today's sun! The days leading up to the Downtown Henderson Merchant's parade, where Ms. Ella, Aaron and Wendell worked on decorating the "little church" after the City delivered to our parking lot and Brad Alexander, Eleanor's dad, delivered his trailer and vehicle to pull it, were bitterly cold. Parade day dawned cold, but warmer, and there was bright sunshine and big blue sky that day too!

We had a blast, as usual, waving and smiling and handing out candy to the crowds of onlookers. However it happened, we ended up either with enough candy or finally devised a

method to how we distributed the candy that the last watchers at Fifth and Elm got candy this year. In prior years, we have run out before then. Many thanks to all who contributed candy and money to buy candy. I dare say some kids ended up with more candy than they got at Halloween! Brandy drove her Mom, Kay, and Ms. Ella, and Marty and I rode on the trailer filling buckets with candy, and handing them to our walkers – Fr. Ben. and Jieun, Wendell, Big Joe (in his surprise Christmas suit!), Susan Sauls, Alexis, Kaleigh, Miranda, Caroline, Eleanor, Wren, Trae, Lavelle, Kalvin and Dylan. Our float was assigned space 44, near Sixth and Main. Santa brought up the rear at space 139, so when our float finished the route, the parade was ongoing. When we caught a break, we scurried across Main to Merritt and some of us then rode the trailer to Washington and Main, had access to the HCPL restrooms, and got to watch the rest of the parade as we waited to cross Main to enter Central Park. At the end of the parade, we trailered the little church into the park and unloaded it next to the castle, off the northwest sidewalk, with the help of strong men eager to help. The little church is heavy and unwieldy but they got 'er done!



Once again, the little church was hardly set in place before we saw and heard children squealing with excitement to enter the church. "It's a church, let's go!" It is heartwarming, delightful and so wonderful that our St. Paul's family can provide this outreach to our community. Thank you to the Thomas family for starting this tradition and maintaining it!

Ms. Ella is concerned about the condition of the church and that it needs some rehabbing. If you have carpentry skills and are looking for a project between now and next December, we will gladly connect you with access to see what it needs to be safe, sturdy and welcoming.

Some of us didn't make it to Central Park after the parade, as the Walaskays opened their home with the warmth of their fire and hospitality, with cheeseburgers, hot chocolate, veggies and cookies and a good time for all! Thank you, Walaskays!

But wait, that's not all – we had gathered the night before the parade to celebrate St. Nicholas Day with the reading of his story, a children's sermon from Fr. Ben., and with pizza before the lighting of the Christmas Tree in Central Park. That was a fun time too!



Strong men, women and children helped haul the storage boxes from upstairs on December 7 to unpack the Christmas decorations so EYC and friends could unpack nativity sets, fluff bows, hang wreaths, put up and decorate Christmas trees, and hang greenery in the nave.
