The liturgical season known as "After Pentecost" lasts as much as half the year. This is the Long Green Time.

Advent and Lent have such resonance that they loom large in my mind even though Advent is never more than four weeks and Lent always exactly 40 days. Christmas and Easter, too, have an outsized impact on our liturgical calendar for the space that each one takes thereon.

Yet Pentecost is just a day, and after the first Sunday following Pentecost, which we call Whitsunday or Trinity Sunday, there's just a long nearly six month—stretch of liturgically green Sundays. The Sunday after All Saints breaks things up around the 1st of November, but otherwise we are in what the calendar refers to "Common Time" for upwards of 29 Sundays.

In my own head I've long divided this extended green season into "Summer", "Fall", and "After All Saints". This summer I've been thinking about updating that internal nomenclature to "Summer", "Harvest Season", and "Pre-Advent". It is quite possible that nobody is very interested in this other than myself, so here's the summary view from the pew: for October and November you'll notice some adjustments to the Sunday morning service that are intended to highlight the Harvest Season.

Our music and prayers both will look to themes of creation. Jieun has selected a Sanctus (the "Holy, Holy, Holy" that comes near the beginning of the Eucharistic prayer) from the Lift Every Voice and Sing hymnal and

adapted that tune again for our fraction anthem later in the service. The subtle gospel feel of these tunes puts me in mind of thanksgiving for the natural and agricultural world and the people who work within those realms. We'll also be singing our Psalms over the next two months, using a method that takes popular hymn tunes and sets the psalm text to them so it feels more like singing another hymn than learning to chant in a monastery (not that there's anything wrong with that!)

Our Eucharistic Prayer for this season I've taken from Enriching Our Worship vol. 1, an officially endorsed liturgical supplement of The Episcopal Church. Eucharistic Prayer 1 has all the same components of Prayers A, B, C, and D which you've heard many times, but focuses again on themes of creation.

To help worshippers understand what's happening, and more importantly (to me at any rate), why it is happening, I'll be doing several small bits of instruction during the Sunday morning services on October 12th, 19th, and 26th. These things often get called "Instructed Eucharists" so that's what I'll call them as well. The general idea is that, two or three times during the service, we'll pause and I'll speak to what is happening and why. I'll keep the sermon shorter during those days in order to balance out the extra bits of talking. I also plan to write these small pieces of explanation out, partly to keep the time under control and also so that anyone who misses one of those Sundays but would like to catch up may do so.

I can't tell you what a joy it is to be doing this work. Jieun and I both are still so enamored of this place and all of its possibilities. I look forward to diving into Harvest Season here in Henderson and at St. Paul's.


Leslie and Buzzy Newman named Henderson Chamber's Distinguished Citizens of Year
